
to develop reforestation projects for the protection and preservation of the environment.

After Hurricane Felix, because of the heavy rains and high winds, many plantations of rice, yucca and bananas were destroyed. The Coco River flooded many villages throughout La Mosquitia in Nicaragua and Honduras. This



upcoming year will be very distressing for many families if they don't start planting their crops very soon. Because of the continuous rain we've had this year; the families have not been able to start planting their crops. We are hoping that by Dec.15th everyone will be in their plantations planting corn, beans and other crops.



Some of our dear friends from different areas of the US have donated money specifically to buy seeds. As of now we have already distributed over 1000 lbs. of corn seeds to different groups of women's organizations from different villages in the zone of Mocoron-Segovia. Special thanks to the Essex

The Rotary Organization is creating miracles with their water projects. Their help in purifying the water has made a huge impact on the people and their children. As of now the majority of families are free from intestinal viruses because their water has been purified by sand filters in the wells. The people of La Mosquitia are so grateful to the Rotary Club for bringing this project to fulfillment. The government has been working side by side with them in these health projects and we hope that next year they will develop more projects with the sand filters and water wells
