From the rain forest of Honduras, La Mosquitia, we wish you a wonderful Thanksgiving, a Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year for 2015!

Many of my friends and family have asked me how I can keep going back and forth to the rain forest for 26 years. My journey's have included flying in small airplanes, walking for hours to reach the villages, fighting malaria, and stepping along in narrow canoes to reach the forgotten indigenous people that for many, are in unreachable locations deep in the jungle.

Well my friends, I came to the conclusion that after all these years, hard times, trials and tribulations that what keeps me going year after year is the pure love of Christ that I have in my heart for the children of Honduras. You are like the light of the sun that always shines. Just as the sun shines giving us warmth, you are the ones that give me positive energy to continue doing this wonderful mission of LOVE AND CHARITY.



When I receive your donations whatever they may be; a box with clothes, shoes, school supplies, first aid, sewing supplies and such, arriving from California, Utah, Texas, New York and many other places, my heart fills with joy. We are bound together by these indigenous families, to help them to become stronger, to help the children become better citizens by bringing knowledge and education to the most remote areas. We are helping them to keep their culture alive and pass it on for generations to come.

Our mission and focus remains the same: Education, Health and the Environment.

We have been distributing school supplies in many schools. This year we helped the Pre-Kindergarten school of Ferema by finding a new teacher. The government has stopped paying the teacher and we now have to find a way to pay him so that the young children can continue to receive an education. The children are learning new and better ways to plant gardens, flowers and other edible fruit trees. With the doctor now in Mocoron we have a special program for the malnourished babies to help them gain weight and thrive. USAID has a project in progress where they will be building latrines for the village and will install purified water by using gravity and new water wells.
